The 26th Philatelic Congress of Great Britain will be held in Liverpool June 13-16, 1939. We are informed by the Hon. Treas. S. Lord, 20 Hackins Hey, Liverpool 2, that the P.O. are providing a special Congress postmark. Covers to bear this postmark should be in the hands of the above before June 1st. The sponsoring Philatelic Societies are also issuing a set of Souvenir Postcards which have reproductions of over ninety typical Liverpool postmarks dating from 1707. The cards are available (set of 8) at two shillings. In addition there is a limited edition of Souvenir Stamp Labels in sheets of 12. They are mostly scenes of Liverpool and the sheets come in four colours, Blue, Green, Red and Sepia. The price is one shilling per sheet and orders for a quantity will be made up of an equal number of each colour.
