OUR PRESIDENT REQUESTS -

Every member is urgently asked to help the Society to reach their objective of 1000 members by April 1st, 1947. We have 900 now and can raise that other 100 in three months (one a day) by your assistance. Don't forget my own personal prize for your efforts during the year. The deadline is April 1st.

Are you coming to the Annual Meeting on April 11th & 12th. Are you intending to Exhibit? There are lots of things we would like to know, so why not drop us a line,

but don't leave it to George to do it.

The Directors of the C.P.S. are pleased to add the name of Mr. Earl B. Forney, of St. Paul, Minnesota, as a Regional Director for the Mid-Western United States.

We are advised that Mr. Deauville has stated that the 1st Printing (Die I) of the new 17¢ stamp has been exhausted at the Agency. The 2nd Printing which went on sale in Ottawa on Dec. 3rd, has the accent corrected. We had a report that the background shading had been seen "cleared up". If this is the case our GUESS is that an eye should be kept open for "Die III". If, as many surmise, there is a change in the rates it may then occasion another change. Interest is still keen and we have not as yet bought a copy of Die II locally.

NEW STAMP --- MARCH 3RD

A C.P. dispatch from Ottawa reports that a new Canadian Four Cent Stamp will be issued shortly to commemorate the contenary of the birth of Alexander Graham Bell, the inventor of the Telephone, 100 years after Bell's birth in Edinburgh, Scotland. Some doubt has been cast upon Bell's status as a "Canadian" citizen, but there is apparently no regulation to prevent his portrait being used on a Canadian stamp.

The stamp is expected to be the same size and color as the present four cent stamp. It will carry the name "Alexander Graham Bell", value, and the centenary dates, 1847-1947.

The stamp should involve no confusion among the claimants to the Birthplace of the telephone itself. However, the most appropriate place for First Day Covers will doubtless be Brantford, or more properly, Tutela Heights (site of the Bell Homestead).

From the Western Stamp Collector we learn that the United States will issue a commemorative stamp for Edison's 100th Birthday, to be released from Milan, Ohio, on February 11th.

Interest will shortly centre on the new issue. already illustrated in the press of stamps in honour of the visit of the Royal Family to South Africa.

Quite a few collectors have taken advantage of the pre-distribution offer of the Crippled Children's Society of a full sheet of the Easter Seals, and an imperforate block of four at one dollar. It has become possible to offer a set of Progressive Proofs to anyone sending for five of the regular lots. These will make a most instructive display and the number available is very limited. Anyone interested should address Bert L. Baulch, Field-Secretary of the Ontario Society for Crippled Children, 444 Church Street, Toronto.

We understand that there is a strong possibility of the Scott Publications printing their Canadian Albums and the next edition of the Catalogue in Canada. Canadian Philatelists will welcome such a move in view of the mounting strength of collectors in his country.

PLAN NOW TO ATTEND THE ANNUAL MEETING AND EXHIBITION AT THE ROYAL YORK HOTEL IN TORONTO ON APRIL 11 & 12, 1947

What is believed to be a new record for delivery in Toronto of mail from England is reported in Toronto papers, when one of a total of 4200 letters coming to Canada by trans-Atlantic plane, was found to be postmarked - London, Eng., Wednesday 7.30 P.M., and was delivered to a Toronto office at 2.30 p.m., Thursday afternoon - a matter of 19 hours after posting. Mail from the London area, it is explained, was collected on Wednesday afternoon and evening, put on the Trans-Atlantic planeat 8.00 o'clock and arrived in Montreal next morning in time to connect with TCA Flight 43 for Malton. Trucks then carried it to Postal Terminal "A", Toronto, where it was sorted in time for the Thursday afternoon delivery in downtown Toronto.

THE CANADIAN FHILATELIC SOCIETY

The "C.P.S." is the National Body of Canadian Stamp Collectors. Re-organized around 30 years ago, its growth has progressed steadily until today it's membership stands close to the thousand mark. The Society's charter, obtained twenty years ago, sets out its ten-fold purpose as follows:

1. To encourage and promote the science of Philately by the acquirement and

study of stamps.

2. To cultivate fraternal relations and mutual friendship among Philatelists.

3. To encourage and assist new collectors and to foster the interest of youth.

4. To assist local clubs and societies wherever possible.

5. To promote stamp exhibitions, and displays which tend to advance the status of the hobby.

To assist members in acquiring and disposing of stamps, both individually

and through the departments provided.

7. To discover and suppress the purchase, sale and exchange of forgeries and unauthorized issues of stamps.

. To stimulate and advance the relations between collectors and kindred

organizations in the British Empire and Foreign Countries.

9. To demonstrate the fact that Philately is an educational, serious and entertaining pursuit.

10. To represent stamp collecting interest generally as a national organ.

The Affiliated Clubs from coast to coast now number around forty, which gives a total following of many thousand Canadian Collectors. There are also numerous sponsored groups, particularly Junior Hobby and Craft organizations receiving guidance from C.P.S. members.

A Club may become an Affiliated Club on the payment of \$10.00 covering Four Members or Delegates (who are privileged to vote with the Directors at the Annual Meeting). Thereafter any further members are entitled to join the C.P.S. at a rate of \$1.50 per year plus the usual admission fee of \$1.00.
