AUCTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Lots may be accepted from any member of the Toronto District Unit.
2. All lots must be received not later than 8.00 P.M. on night of meeting.
3. Each lot must be mounted (Preferably on letterhead size sheets) and described in detail showing Scott's numbers and catalogue value, condition, used or unused, centering, etc. - otherwise lots will be refused.
4. Material may be accepted or refused at the discretion of Auction Committee.
5. Not more than five lots may be submitted by any one member.
6. All lots sold are subject to 10% commission. Minimum 5 cents.
7. Total lots per night are not to exceed 60. It is suggested that no lot should have a catalogue value of less than \$1.00. First come, first served - anything in excess, if not used that night, will be held over to next meeting.
8. We want good material. Members should study likes and dislikes of bidders and act accordingly. No damaged material will be welcome.

Damaged Material will definitely be discouraged. Some of the old classics may be accepted, but modern issues will definitely not be accepted. We wish to maintain a high standard and we will expect members to co-operate with us. Good material and good prices will be our aim.
