These films are talkies and portray the complete manufacture of British Jubilee Stamps and the incidents relative to the issuing of the first postage stamp, the penny black.

We want every member of the Society to be present if possible at these showings of the films as they will not be shown anywhere else in Canada. Be sure and arrange to come to town for this period.

Through the kindness of the T. Eaton Co., Ltd., the films will be shown at least four times daily at their main store on Queen St. at Yonge. Notice will be furnished in the press as to the actual hours. Admission is free and everyone is welcome. Don't forget the dates--June 29th to July 4th.
