In 1900 the Dominican Republic issued a set of stamps showing its boundary extending into the territory of it neighbour, Haiti. This started intermittent border conflicts between the two republics until 1938 when the dispute was finally settled. It is estimated that over 15,000 were slain because of this controversy.



Tin Can Mail

This was mail sealed in a 5 gallon can and thrown overboard. It was thereupon picked up by canoe or a swimmer and brought to its destination, the island of Niuatoo of the Tonga group. Another Measured Moment.....

Two-faced Santa

Taking a closer look at your stamps may offer a few surprises! Here is one surprise that I found on a Canadian stamp.

With politicians calling each other, "Two-faced" lately, I must think of the Canadian 1993 86¢ Christmas stamp. That year the focus was on various images of Santa Clause from around the world, including: North America, Poland, Russia, and Australia. The 86¢ stamp shows Father Christmas riding on a Kangaroo rocking horse. At first glance there is nothing strange about Santa's appearance, however, when we take a second look and enlarge the image, we see that Santa has one face, with a beard, looking at the camera, and also a second face, looking backwards.

I don't know if this was intentional, however, I do know that Robert Bateman stated that he was forbidden from signing drawings that he provided for use on Canadian stamps, so he hid little personalized items in each drawing. Perhaps Jeff Jackson, who submitted the illustrations for the 1993 Christmas stamps did the same. If so, who is he showing on the back of Santa's head?
