Joan and her husband Richard (Dick to me) were 2 of the 14 people who met 5 May 1998 when we held the first meeting of the club that would be named *The Saugeen Stamp Club*. You can see her, sitting beside Lois Young, in the photo, taken at that meeting, found in the club's cabination of the club set in our meeting room at St. Matthew's Church

net in our meeting room at St. Matthew's Church. Lois and Joan were friends since kindergarten; and I had known Dick and Joan since my days living in Guelph, 1968 – 1972 and was proud to call them friends. Dick always had a joke or two and Joan was most hospitable and had the most marvelous smile. At that time I was involved in breeding Dalmation dogs and whenever we were away from home, Joan guickly offered to "baby-sit" our dogs, especially Adam and Dolly. She had lots of help from her three kids who always wanted to walk the dogs. Both Dick and Joan collected stamps, with Joan focusing on the stamps of Palestine and Israel. She and I often marveled at the Israeli stamps with the attached tabs with added information about the subject on the stamp.

Dick passed away in 2010 and Joan went to join him in September 2020. Richard was a Pastor, in the Baptist Church and Joan gave strong support, often offering a children's story during the service. When retired, they remained in Walkerton until

health concerns compelled them to move into a Long Term Care Home. Joan made friends easily and had many friends in the home in Waterloo where she spent her last years. All that time she kept up interest in our Club and it is sad to lose another one of our founding members.


## Another Measured Moment.....

#### Mike "Pinball" Clemons

You will find "Pinball" Clemons on the stamps listed as Scott #2567h and 2575. He is recognized by most Canadians as the best known Toronto Argonaut and for being always upbeat and having a positive attitude. As a long time Augonaut fan, I was pleased to meet "Pinball" at a fancy dinner, hosted by the Bruce County Federation of Agriculture where he was the featured speaker. While most of the crowd of about 200 were wearing their Sunday Best I was wearing my Argonaut T-shirt. When he came into the banquet hall Mike came straight over to me, we chatted and he gave me his last Grey Cup Ring; *sadly I had to return it after the dinner and speeches.* While addressing the gathering and answering many questions, he remarked "Some people say I was a great football player, Oh No! I was just a coward, every time someone gave me the ball, everyone wanted to jump on me, so I just ran away".

In April the *Toronto Star* interviewed "Pinball" Clemons, now general manager of the Argonauts, about how the COVID 19 situation was affecting him and the CFL. His answer was very typical of this man he said, "For me the uncertainty is not the priority. The priority is making sure we are doing all that we need to do to take care of all Canadians - - - It's like being a good team member - - - so let's control what we can control and do our part." I believe that we should all heed the advice of this "coward" who is also a Great Canadian.

Mike Clemons was born in the USA, but came to Canada to play football. He told me that his first day here, he was not eligible to play so he saw his first CFL game from my favourite place, section 526 at the SkyDome; in the end zone looking down on all the action along the goal line and facing the Jumboton to see action at the other end of the field. He enjoyed Canada, stayed, and chose to become a Canadian and raise his family here. I am proud to call him a fellow Canadian, although I wish that I could have kept that Grey Cup Ring.


The world of stamps had expected this to happen, but who'd take the first step wasn't very clear.
