Canada Post has done it again.

ing that each fulltime employee received the following booklet of 10 "P" "Thank You" stamps. I received one from an employee in the Goderich Post Office. It does pay to be friends and this employee has treated me well over the past number of years at the counter. It is my understanding that the stamps will



not be sold over the counter nor by mail, I could be wrong, but? Note the booklet has no Bar Code for scanning purposes.

"Correction" I received a note from our esteemed member from Carlow NB this past week. He kindly corrected my statement in the last bulletin concerning salvage on stamps. As I stated "salvage on the edges around stamps" is an incorrect use of the word as spelled. Salvage is the remains of a rusty old ship/vessel resting on the ocean floor. What we have on the edges of stamps is selvage (US spelling) or selvege (British spelling). Selvege is also the finished edge on a sheet of cloth that keeps it from unraveling. Since cloth was invented before stamps, I am assuming the printers borrowed the term from the weavers. "Thank you" to Ralph for your assistance.

How do you use the very common term F.D.C. (First Day Cover). F.D.C. of what – stamp, commemorative cover, show, exhibition, event (flight)? Used by many Post Office Bureau's O.F.D.C. – (Official First Day Cover) but also by many Post Office Bureau's D.O.I.C. – Day (Date) of Issue Cover Used by Canada Post.

I need help – can we answer a question as to how to collect the commercial Picture Postage. How much of the cover do we save for the details needed?

Another Measured Moment.....

St. John's Anglican Church - Wakefield, New Zealand

In the years 1970 - 1987, New Zealand annually issued 3 Christmas stamps. Typically the mid-value stamp featured some New Zealand church. In 1981 the church chosen was St. John's Anglican Church in the village of Wakefield, about 30 miles south of Nelson, the northern most city on the South Island.

This church is the oldest church on the South Island and was built in 1846. A feature of this church that attracts tourists from around the world is seen on the ceiling. It seems that when the building was under construction they had some wet weather and a cat with wet feet walked on some of the lumber being prepared for the new building. The tracks left by that cat were never washed off and they can be seen to-day, high above the worshipers by anyone in the building.







These stamps are a set of 3 known as the "Black Border" Christmas stamps as they are the only set of Christmas stamps to show that feature.

Carlow Clips by Ralph Wyndham

Firstly, I want to share a cute little story about a stamp purchase I made recently on Hipstamp. The cover in which the stamps arrived was so obviously prepared with such great care that I was moved to message the vendor with my complements for the care taken. I made the observation that "It looks like you have a very cooperative person behind the post office counter in Collingwood Corner" to which he replied, "My wife is the cooperative person behind the counter ... She's the postmaster there." How lucky can one collector be? It's such a sharp contrast to Walt's experience with the "Iron Lady" postmaster in Brussels.

Secondly, going back to Jim's 'Falkland Islands' Measured Moment in the November Bulletin, I thought it was interesting to observe that the post office in Stanley still had many full sheets of these iconic stamps in stock 49 years after they had been issued and 12 years after the switch to the decimal pound. I wonder if Jim would be able to add the stamps to his collection if these had made it onto the market?

As for penguins on the Falklands, besides the king penguin depicted on that old 5 shilling stamp, two other species, the Magellanic and Gentoo, also reside here. That war almost 40 years ago now provided an unexpected boon to these two small penguin species. When the Argentineans invaded, they mined the beach in Yorke Bay, near Stanley. Because they are too light to set off explosions, these little penguins have, over the decades, established a thriving colony among the mines.

Sadly, however, this situation may end soon. Although the island residents say they are ok with leaving the mines in place in order to leave the birds alone, Britain, as a signatory to the Ottawa land mine convention, is obligated to remove the mines, likely causing a great deal of harm to the colony.
