THE MEXICO EXPORTA DEFINITIVES.......Bill Findlay

This definitive issue is a fun and fascinating challenge to the collector. They were designed by Rafael Davidson between 1975 and 1993 to promote Mexican exports. There were four main "sets" issued in that time period: the Air Mail issue of 1975-1982; the Ground issue of 1975-1982; the 100's issue of 1983-1987 ; and the 1000's issue of 1988-1993. Within these four groups there are 28 themes in 14 sub-series, with a total of 112 official variations. They run in value from 5 centavos to 7200 pesos (some inflation involved here!), with an additional 40 different colour variations, perforation varieties and two types of burelage printing.

(*Burelage* (French: *burelage*), also burelé, is a French term referring to an intricate network of fine lines, dots or other designs printed over or as the background of some postage or revenue stamps to prevent counterfeiting.)

This is an example (Scott #1601) of the Type I Burelage, where the curve of the lines is toward the lower right corner of the stamp. The Type II has the curve towards the upper left.
