
ANOTHER 'MEASURED" MOMENT......Jim Measures

MOZAMBIQUE COMPANY

Like many of my fellow collectors, I have a good deal of fondness for the old bi-colour engraved stamps, the most famous being the USA's Inverted Jenny. Not so famous, but far more available, are those issued by Mozambique Company.

But how is it that stamps issued by a corporate entity get official status in the catalogues? Portugal's place in the history of global exploration, trade and colonization is very significant. By 1500 Portugal had established outposts virtually around the world including on the Indian Ocean, along Africa's southeastern coast, in territory that would eventually become Mozam-

bique.



Founded February 11, 1891, the Mozambique Company's charter, lasting 50 years, required it to develop and exploit the resources of an area consisting of Manica and Sofala provinces. The company was given a 25 year tax exemption but had the right to collect taxes and to conscript locals to work for them. In exchange, the company was to settle 1000 Portu-

guese families and provide public administration including a postal service. In return, Portugal was to receive 7.5% of profits and 10% of the company.

Essentially undercapitalized, the company was unable to meet its obligations. Revenue came largely from taxation, income from sub-leases and the use of forced labour on its plantations. The practice of conscripting labour was extremely unpopular with the indigenous population and was the cause of rebellions in 1902 and 1917. Though required to maintain law and order, the company was unable to do so during either crisis forcing Portugal to send forces, at great expense, to end the unrest.



Due to its poor performance and a change in policy in Portugal, Mozambique Company's charter was not renewed when it expired on July 8, 1942. According to the Governor of Manica and Sofala at the time, "[the Company] did nothing to develop the potential wealth of this entire region, preferring to plunder it and alienate the natives." The company continued to operate in
