ANOTHER 'MEASURED" MOMENT......Jim Measures

KING EDWARD VIII

In 1936 when King Edward VIII was King of England for less than a year, only one set of four stamps were issued for him during his reign. He had been honoured as Prince of Wales by Canada and several other colonies but never as King. The Colonies and Dominions, including Canada, all prepared stamps with Edward's portrait but none were ever issued. The British four stamp set was also overprinted for use in Morocco with various overprints indicating that they were denominated in British,

Spanish, Italian or French Currency. On December 11 1936, the front page of the Daily Herald was taken up with the story of King Edward's abdication. This included a small item stating "The existing stocks of King Edward stamps will continue to be issued until stocks are exhausted. Within a quarter of an hour of the abdication announcement, the Post Office at Southampton was raided by philatelists who purchased all of the King Edward stamps, particularly the higher denominations." Today most dealers will sell a complete set of the four stamps for \$1.00 or less. According to my 2014 Scott catalogue, the most expensive of the King Edward stamps is the 1d overprinted 10 centimos (Italian currency) for use in Mo-



rocco. Scott's price for this stamp is 55c mint and \$2.25 used.

Editor's note and apology:

Herewith the complete final paragraph of the Mozambique Company article which appeared in the last Bulletin. Said article was not written by Jim Measures but rather by Ralph Wyndham—my apologies to Ralph for making such a mess of his excellent writing!

Due to its poor performance and a change in policy in Portugal, Mozambique Company's charter was not renewed when it expired on July 8, 1942. According to the Governor of Manica and Sofala at the time, "[the Company] did nothing to develop the potential wealth of this entire region, preferring to plunder it and alienate the natives." The company continued to operate in Mozambique until 1961 when it became a holding company.
